Suggestions for solving: You can use the rule whereby the riddler answers only by YES or NO. Another rule if there are several players: Each solver has the right to ask questions until he gets an affirmative answer. Also, you can limit the number of questions asked.

The authors advises and to a certain extent thought up these tales with the intention that you never under any condition read the solution before you've tried really hard to solve the riddle.

The solutions require a little general knowledge of Nature and its laws inasmuch as these stories are for the most part logical brain-teasers.

Although these riddle tales are set in the mysterious world of a trapper settlement, all of them can be solved without the use of magic, powerful shamans' potions or knowledge of old trapper legends.

One thing is for sure: by going through these tales you'll learn and always remember a great number of useful things.

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY

The level of difficulty of these tales is indicated by the number of ginkgo leaves.

One ginkgo leaf: easy

Two ginkgo leaves: fairly easy
Three ginkgo leaves: a little harder

Four ginkgo leaves: hard Five ginkgo leaves: really hard

Six ginkgo leaves: frighteningly hard

More than six ginkgo leaves: mission impossible

Tea made from its unusual leaves enhances concentration and clarity of the mind. "I don't think this race is fair," their friend criticized.


"Boko's the one who set the conditions!" said Oran.
